To quote the Rev. Dr. William J. Barber II

"When we hear the cries of those who are mourning, we know America needs nothing less than a Third Reconstruction. Mourning means people still believe things can change. You don't protest what you believe is unchangeable, you destroy it. Protest is hope. The hope is in the mourning. And it is deep. We must cry out with all who hunger for justice."

Lament

As a verb: it is to feel, show, or express grief, sorrow, or regret.

Used as a noun: it's physically crying out in grief, it's wailing

Deep pain has emerged around the world. Against the backdrop of a global pandemic, which has taken over 111,000 U.S. lives and over 398,000 lives through the world, protests have erupted around the United States (and the world) after the murder of George Floyd, at the hands of Minneapolis police officers. Of course, it was only the latest in an all-too-familiar pattern of black and brown bodies dying due to systemic racism.

We must say their names: George Floyd. Ahmaud Arbery. Breonna Taylor.



These numbers are more than statistics, they are children of God.

They were neighbors, friends and family-grandfathers and grandmothers, fathers and mothers, aunts and uncles, brothers and sisters, son and daughters and even children.

As people of faith we must not pass by this moment to quickly or easily.

We must stop. As people of faith we must weep. We must mourn. We must honor. And we must lament, which is to feel and bear great grief and sorrow, and reflect upon it.
